MINUTES WOOLWICH TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MARCH 7, 2022

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Frederick at 6:33 p.m.

Mayor Fredrick made the following statement:

The March 7, 2022 meeting of the Woolwich Township Committee is being called to order. Adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Solicitor Gaglione and Administrator/Clerk DiBella were also present on the dais.

Deputy Mayor Callahan moved to open the meeting to public comment. Committeewoman Minhas seconded. All were in favor.

Ann Dorsett, 169 Russell Mill Road questioned resolution R-2022-91. Mayor Frederick advised that the resolution is to enter into a partnership with South Jersey Land and Water Trust to conduct studies of the Oldmans and Raccoon Creek Watershed through grant funds.

Ralph Sharp, 26 Russell Mill Road asked if the Committee has begun discussions regarding limiting the number of cannabis licenses that will be allowed in the Township and if there have been any more license applicants.

Mayor Frederick advised that the Committee has not had those discussions, and that no other applicants have come forward.

The Committee entered closed session at 6:43 p.m. for the purpose of discussing Personnel: Police Chief Position and Negotiations: TDR Program.

The regular meeting resumed at 7:07 p.m. upon a motion by Committeeman Marino, seconded by Dep. Mayor Callahan and unanimously passed.

Motion was made by Deputy Mayor Callahan and seconded by Committeeman Marino to approve the bills and purchase orders.
